Notes:

1. Aboriginal Identity refers to those persons who reported identifying with at least one Aboriginal group, i.e. North American Indian, Métis or Inuit. Also included are individuals who did not report an Aboriginal identity, but did report themselves as a Registered or Treaty Indian, and/or Band or First Nation membership.
2. In 2001, there were 30 Indian reserves and settlements in which enumeration was not permitted or interrupted before completed. Data are not available for these incompletely enumerated Indian reserves and settlements. As a result, there is greater undercoverage for the Aboriginal population than among other segments of the population in the 2001 Census.
3. The population totals from the 20% sample data given here do not include residents of institutions. As a result, the population totals in this table will differ from the previously released totals for Saskatchewan.
