- oldest indigenous community in Saskatchewan - established in 1774 as a Hudson's Bay Trading Post.
- Cumberland House -160km north and east of Nipawin
- nestled in the beautiful northern forest on the banks of the Saskatchewan River

Challenges

- deep rooted history of aboriginal culture
- geographic obstacles
- limited trading area for the economy
- limited resource base

Project Overview

- begins to address the direction of Population Health Promotion
