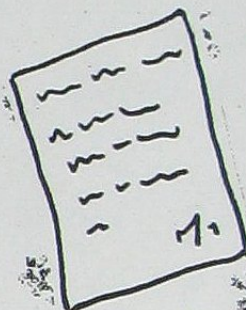
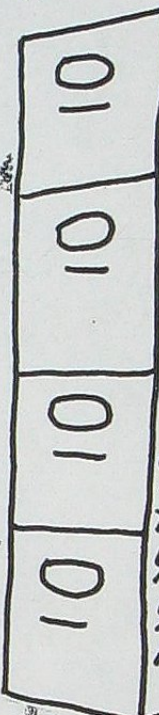
Simply put, an archive is a place where historical documents and other traces of the past are kept. It's kind of like a big filing cabinet.

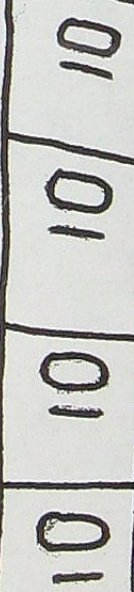

After Stonewall, #9/79

In June, 1978, we held our first organizing meeting in Moose Jaw. Nine local lesbians were there. A couple of weeks later on June 30th, that group held its first social. There were a dozen people there; ten lesbians and two gay men. On July 1st, Anita Bryant came to Moose Jaw and most of the group marched

, not as identified gays but they did march and they would march again.

The assumption seems always to have been, that although we are everywhere, that everyone with the where-with-all to do so will leave Sioux Lookout, Moose Jaw and Medicine Hat for the "bright lights" and "safety" of a larger place. Efforts to reach out those who remain have been minimal. The nature of the national movement has reflected that. The movement has been organized from the top down, the perspectives and their articulations have been urban and concentrated in the hands of the few.

Archival documents are used to write histories.

But some information is always left out.

Some events don't get written down or the records are not kept. But the lives and activism of LGBT people living in small centres and rural areas are worth remembering!

## GAY from the Horse's Mouth

"The afternoon demonstration began with about 85 persons marching from the C.P. Rail station at the end of Main St. Parade was under police escort.

Along the route the marchers chanted such slogans as "Gay Rights Now" and "Stop Anita Now." It picked up people as it proceeded to Athabasca St. and by the time the march reached the amphitheatre in Crescent Park, its ranks had increased to about 150."

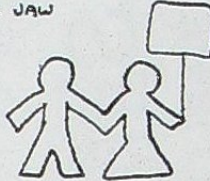

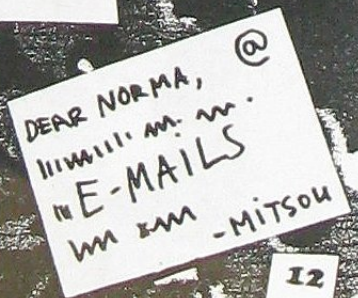
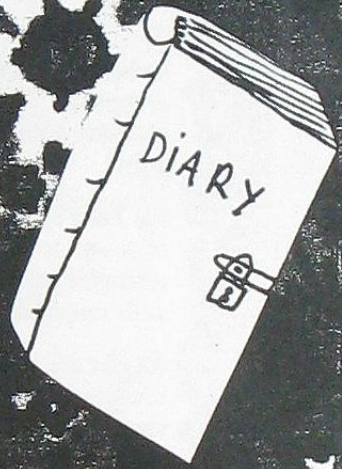

## Saskatchewan Archives Board – Donor Agreements

### Typical clauses regarding length/terms of restricted access:

The records shall remain closed to consultation or research for a period of \_\_\_\_\_ years, subject, however, to the following provisions:

(i) The Donor shall have access to the records during this period and may authorize by writing any person to have access to the same.

OR

(i) The Donor or any person authorized by the donor, including (insert name and contact information of designate), shall have access to the records during this period and may authorize by writing any person to have access to the same.

(ii) The Provincial Archivist and his staff shall have the right of access to the records for the purpose of preserving, arranging, classifying, boxing and storing them in accordance with standard archival procedures.

(iii) At the expiration of \_\_\_\_\_ years from the date of creation of the records (or date of death of donor), the records shall be available for research purposes in accordance with regulations which may hereafter be established by the Saskatchewan Archives Board or its successors providing for the use of material in its possession.

OR

The materials shall be available for consultation and research in accordance with regulations which may hereafter be established by the Saskatchewan Archives Board or its successors providing for the use of material in its possession.
